

### NATIONAL PATIENT PARTICIPATION WEEK

#### 03-09 JUNE 2024

# JUNE 10 - JUNE 16

The theme "Sharing our Stories" urges men to share their experiences, inspired by King Charles who, earlier this year, shared that he had a problem with an enlarged prostate. On the day after his announcement, there were 11 times more visits to the relevant National Health Service website page compared with data from the previous day. Prostate Cancer UK saw an almost doubling in the number of users of its online risk checker. This goes to show the difference that honest sharing can make.

#### You may also be surprised to find out that:

only 36% of patients using NHS first line talking therapies are men. 11% of men feel that they have no friends. 8.7% of men are dependent on alcohol meaning that men are nearly three times more likely than women to become alcohol dependent. If you are aged between 40-74 you may be entitled to an NHS health check which is essentially an 'MOT' for your body. One of our healthcare assistants will take a BP reading, blood samples and measure your BMI. A week later a nurse will call you to discuss your risk of heart disease, diabetes, kidney disease and stroke.



Carers Week is an annual awareness campaign to celebrate and recognise the vital contribution made by the UK's 5.7 million carers. A survey by <u>Carers UK</u> found that for 82% of carers, the impact of caring on their physical and mental health would be a challenge over the coming year, and for nearly 60%, being valued as a carer would improve their well-being.
